Groewood has been designated a Local Nature Reserve following a site survey from the Herts and Middlesex Wildlife Trust, the Parish Council Rangers will be working with Local residents to carry out some remedial work this winter to enhance and protect the area.

COMMUNITY PLAN 12 MONTHS ON

The Chorleywood Community Plan was distributed to all households in the Parish in the autumn of 2015 and here is a brief update on progress made since.



- 'Chorleywood in Bloom', organised by the Parish Council, and with the help of volunteers continues in the aim of improving the aspect of the shopping parades and main areas around the Parish. The Chair of the Council presented the winner of the best summer hanging basket competition to E-Clips with a certificate. There are currently 55 winter baskets and 10 sponsored planters bringing colour to the village during the winter months.
- At their 1st birthday celebrations on 9 November, Chorleywood Library Volunteers were presented with an Award for their collective volunteering. The team of 45 active volunteers were voted runners up in the Volunteer Team of the Year category at Hertfordshire Year of Volunteering Awards 2016. As part of the celebration, volunteers and guests, including County Cllr Chris Hayward who provided start-up funding through his Locality Budget, enjoyed a cake, in the shape of a book with a JK Rowling quote: *"If in doubt, go to a Library"*. Chair of CLV, Angela Killick, says *"We need more volunteers urgently. We have managed because some volunteers are especially generous with their time. But when volunteers go on holiday or fall ill we have a real problem. If you value us, please contact us. Training provided."* cwlvolunteers@gmail.com or 01923 282626, or call in at the Library.
- A draft Neighbourhood Plan has been prepared and the Parish Council is liaising with Three Rivers District Council to ensure that there is nothing that contravenes the Local Development Plan. TRDC will have to appoint an independent assessor before putting the Neighbourhood Plan forward to a public referendum.
- The Parish Council's plans for a Nature Trail on the Common are moving forward and there will be more news next year. Some funding towards any expenses has already been secured.
- The Parish Council has set up a Working Party, which includes a District Councillor and the Residents Association, to consider the Community's concerns about Parking in the Village.
- Chorleywood continues to be a safe place to live, with the Parish Council funding the PCSOs that patrol our Community. Please view the Community Policing page on the Parish Council website to see news, crime statistics and safety tips.
- The Parish was surprised by the response in the questionnaire regarding the maintenance of the Lawn Cemetery and wondered whether there was confusion between it and the one around Christchurch. The Parish Council continues in its endeavours to maintain the Lawn Cemetery to a high standard.
