Other News

- We were expecting to see an increase in burglaries over the Christmas period, so officers were tasked with burglary patrols within Three Rivers. As a result we have seen a decrease in burglaries, with 35 for Three Rivers in November and 23 in December. Chorleywood has also had two less burglaries than last month.
- Words of advice are still being given to youths in relation to their behaviour and use of bicycles.
- In December we saw a decrease in Motor Vehicle Crime, with five incidents in November and three in December.
