**Other News and events**

- Three Rivers overall saw an increase in burglary in February, however Chorleywood saw a decrease. There were two dwelling burglaries in February, compared to the previous month where there were five. Proactive work is on-going to tackle burglaries and anyone who witnesses suspicious activity is asked to report it to police straightaway.
- Speed checks were carried out in Green Street during February and will continue in the coming weeks. We hope that this will deter drivers from speeding in a built up, busy area and especially around school time when there are a vast amount of school children around.
