Other News and events

- PCSOs carried out a bike marking event in March. Although it was snowing, there was a good turn out and around 30 bikes were marked up.
- Unfortunately Chorleywood saw an increase in dwelling burglaries during March. As a result burglary patrols have been increased. Enquiries have been carried out and crime prevention advice issued.
- Reports of criminal damage increased across Three Rivers in March, with 47 incidents reported compared to 29 the previous month. However, Chorleywood saw no reports of criminal damage.
- We have seen an increase in theft of number plates in the Chorleywood area. We will be holding a Plate Safe where crime prevention advice and tamperproof number plate screws will be available. Look out for details on our social media sites.
